If you do not have a ball use a toilet roll or pair of socks.

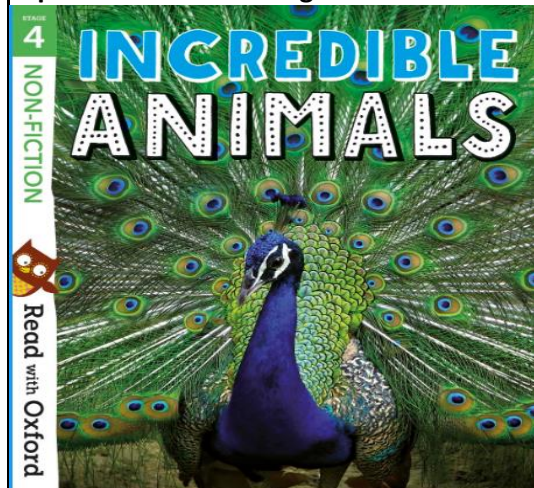
