EYFS

This week in nursery we have started Phonics lessons beginning with the sounds s,a,t and p. Ask your child all about the actions and Robot Rick! We walked around the grounds collecting leaves and sticks for our Autumn tuff tray, exploring colours, smells and environmental sounds outside. In P.E we have enjoyed our dance topic and singing nursery rhymes in Music, we have also looked at body parts and the children have drawn around themselves using chalk.



Key Stage 1

This week, KS1 have continued to learn about Guy Fawkes and the gunpowder plot. We discussed the problems the plotters encountered and how this led to Guy Fawkes' capture. In Jigsaw, the children discussed the rights they hold and the responsibilities they have. We have been delighted to see everyone with their bookbags this week. Key Stage 2 – Lower

Class 2 have had a good week. We have been practising our blending techniques when using oil pastels. Y3 have been looking at the place value of numbers to 1,000 and Y4 numbers to 10,000. We have been learning about the different eras in the Stone Age and we talked about which era we would have preferred to live in and why. We finished off with writing a character description of Arthur.

Key stage 2 – Upper

We have had a busy week in class 3! The children charted the development of babies and discussed what the results show us. In history we began to find out about the Industrial Revolution and in art we have been using oil pastels to create pieces of abstract art. Remember: Our PE will be on a Wednesday
